



**NCLB Title I – Program Improvement (PI)  
Parent Notification Letters for Schools  
2011-2012**

The No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) of 2001 requires that parents of students attending schools that are identified as Program Improvement (PI) must be notified of the school's Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) and the educational opportunities that are offered to eligible students.

The California Department of Education (CDE) has not yet released the final California Standards Test (CST) data and 2011 PI status. It is anticipated that the data will be available in September. Upon release of the data by CDE, the Parent Notification letter for schools will be distributed to parents.

The NCLB Parent Letter will include the AYP data and the following educational options:

**Public School Choice:** Parents of children attending PI schools Year 1 and beyond may choose to transfer to a non-Program Improvement school within the district with transportation provided. Since there is only one school per grade span in OUSD, transferring to another school within the district is not possible. We are completing a cooperative agreement with Princeton Unified School District for students enrolled at Mill Street Elementary and Fairview Elementary Schools. While CK Price Intermediate and Orland High School may show a PI designation on the CDE test reporting site, they are no longer receiving Title I funds and are not subject to Title I requirements - they are not providing NCLB Choice. Inter-district transfer forms are available at the District Office.

**Supplemental Education Services (SES):** Students from low-income families attending PI schools Year 2 and beyond whose parents did not select a public school choice option are eligible for free SES. These tutoring services take place outside of the regular school day with educational providers approved by the California Department of Education. Parent information packets will be sent home to eligible families after school begins. An application for SES will be included in the SES parent information packet.
