3. COMMUNITY-STAFF AND/OR PRINCIPAL'S REPORTS:

- **3.1** Student of the Month Recognition: Orland High School Principal Victor Perry introduced student of the month, Ruby Testerman. She is an extremely goal oriented student and sets very high standards for herself and expectations. Ruby participates in many extracurricular activities, she is in a rigorous college prep program with advanced placement courses. She has a weighted GPA of 4.2. She has earned the principal award the last seven semesters and is on track to be a life member of the California Scholarship Federation as a seal bearer. Mr. Perry presented her with the student of the month plaque.
- **3.2** Principal's Report: Principal Perry reported on the Trojan boot camp that was held this summer. This program was to close the gap with the incoming eighth graders. It was a two-week program. During the two weeks the outline was about OHS; what they are going to learn there, they got a tour of the campus, talked about the importance of being involved and building a resume while at OHS. Also went over a four-year plan, what a diploma will get you after high school; military, college, CTE pathway. They did some fun activities with the students. There were some community partners that came and spoke with the students, Butte College, TAY Center, United States Army. We spent some time talking about mental health and wellness, some of the supports and different options that they have. We had a family engagement meeting and went over what their students were learning and got general feedback on the program and how we can improve it for next year. At the end we had a celebration. We had eighteen applications out of the thirty-nine that we invited. Twelve students attended 100%, 2 students 90%, 1 student 80%, 1 student 50% and 1 student 10%. We had OHS staff and one CK staff, part of the idea was that they had someone that they felt comfortable with. Fourteen of the students left with a four-year plan, what they want to do after high school, how they are going to get there and what they need to do to graduate. Fourteen students completed the feedback survey, in that survey 100% believed that the boot camp helped prepare them for high school, 100% believed that the staff supported them during the camp, 100% reported that they would do it again and refer their friends and family. The parents that completed the survey reported that the boot camp has prepared their child for high school, the staff supported their child throughout the program and that they would send their child to the camp again and would refer their friends and family. Ms. Hess checked into how they are doing now. Nine of the students had C's or better, 95% attendance rate and no behavior concerns. It has given us an opportunity to help out students with high needs, we will continue to track them this year. The students received five credits for completing boot camp.
- **3.3** School Representative Report: OHS students reported that Orland won the battle of the axe 40-0, cheer decorated Orland Round Table for battle of the axe and beat Willows in the cheer decoration competition. Tennis is currently undefeated winning eight matches, varsity volleyball beat Hamilton and will play Corning tonight. Homecoming will be October 7-11, the theme this year is lights, camera, action. The Freshmen float will be Cars, Sophomore will be teen beach movies, Juniors will be Disney, Seniors will be Wizard of Oz. FFA is holding their annual spirit fire next Thursday before the Corning football game and they are also preparing for their pork sandwich sales. Seniors cow pad bingo fundraiser will be the same night as the spirit fire, over 200 tickets have been sold so far.

3.5 Superintendent's Report:

Superintendent Dwayne Newman reported that he has been trying to listen a lot and learn systems here and suspend judgment until he has enough information to make good calls on that. His first impression is that there are a lot of good things going on for kids and kid learning and for our learning. Great people. He spent the other morning at the cafecito, coffee hour, at the SFRC, he was impressed that they reach out that much and make a concerted effort to reach that portion of our community. Had a great time at the meet and greet last week and at the football game. He will send a weekly report to the board of his activities. Everything is going well from his perspective and he is real excited.

Acting Superintendent Tracy Sailsbery reported that things are going well. Everyone is very positive about Dwayne joining the team. We have had great leadership, great conversations already starting. You can see a different tone and she thinks everybody is enjoying that and looking forward to it. Most of our team district vertical meetings have started and everybody is back on board and working and looking at what we are going to do going forward.

President Kochems stated that this item is to approve a new employment contract for the Orland Unified School District Superintendent. The term of the contract is from September 8, 2019 through June 30, 2022. The compensation proposed to be awarded includes.

A base salary amount of \$187,160

The Superintendent shall also receive \$1,032 per year for having a Masters Degree. The Superintendent shall receive sick leave at the rate of 1 day per month for twelve months of the year. The Superintendent shall provide 225 work days per year. The Superintendent shall receive 20 days of paid vacation per school year.

The Superintendent is eligible to receive health and welfare benefits from the district's insurance providers. All professional dues, subscriptions and technology devices shall be provided by the district at the expense of the district.

All of the above shall be pro-rated for the initial year of the agreement due to the start date of September 8, 2019.
